What has the weight of a penny, can travel 29 mph, and has metabolism that is 300 times faster than an elephants'? It's the Ruby Throated Hummingbird. Join us for a program that's all about hummingbirds. Betsy Fraser, a resident of Sugar Hill, will lead the program with a discussion about the migration of ruby throated hummingbirds, their habits and habitats.

Betsy is a retired environmental scientist who has enjoyed attracting and feeding hummingbirds for more than 20 years. Each spring she tracks hummingbird migration maps to anticipate their arrival in our area. The program will address types of feeders, how to make nectar and how to set up your garden to attract hummers. Betsy will also share experiences of hummers swarming at the feeder, help hummers make it through a freak May snow storm, having hummers eat out of her hand. If you are a hummer aficionado come and share your information. Or if you are getting started, come and learn tips on how to make your yard attractive to hummers.
